What are PLT's or Learning Teams?

Over the past several years, Professional Learning Teams (PLT's) have emerged as a new way for teachers to tap into their collective knowledge and strengths and work together to ensure the success of each and every child.

PLT's (or learning teams) are based on answering three critical questions: What are the students supposed to be learning (curriculum)? How do we know they are learning it (assessment)? What do we do when students do or do not

learn what they were supposed to (remediation and enrichment)?

Using common student assessment data, teachers gather together on a regular basis to discuss these three key questions. The result: incredibly rich discussions centered on the students that generate strategies to help those who are struggling as well as stretch those who are excelling.

PLT's are designed to focus on learning, not teaching - to focus on the stu-

dent, not the teacher. Funny thing is, as we hone our focus more on the children and the evidence of their learning, teachers are benefiting greatly! PLT's have changed the landscape of the teaching profession - for the better!

Now you have a better idea of what teachers will be doing every Wednesday when we dismiss from school early this year. Teachers are so excited! No doubt, your child will benefit greatly!
